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Final Determination of Dumping Investigation: Diaries From The People's Republic of China and Malaysia

Pursuant to section 13 of the Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988 ("the Act"), I hereby give notice that I have made a final determination that, in relation to the importation or intended importation of the goods specified in the First Schedule to this notice ("the subject goods"):

- the subject goods are being dumped; and
- by reason thereof, material injury to the New Zealand industry has been and is being caused.

Notice is hereby given that, acting pursuant to subsections 14(1) and 14(4) of the Act, I have determined the amount of anti-dumping duty to be imposed on the subject goods to be the rates set out in the Second Schedule to this notice.

Pursuant to section 17(b)(ii) of the Act, I have determined that the anti-dumping duty shall be payable from 1 February 2008.

First Schedule

The People's Republic of China and Malaysia

Description of Goods

Diaries with or without covers excluding: diaries with steel ring binders; and wall planners.

The goods are currently classified under tariff item 4820.10.00 and Statistical Key 02J of the Tariff of New Zealand, which classification is provided for convenience and Customs purposes only, the written description being dispositive.

Amount of Anti-dumping Duty

**Termination of Dumping Investigation: Diaries
From the Special Administrative Region of Hong
Kong China, Indonesia and the Republic of Korea**

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to section 11 of the Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988, I have terminated a dumping investigation undertaken in accordance with section 10 of that Act into diaries, with or without covers, excluding diaries with steel ring binders and wall planners from the Special Administrative

Region of Hong Kong China, Indonesia and the Republic of Korea.

I have terminated the investigation in respect of the Special Administrative Region of Hong Kong China, Indonesia and the Republic of Korea as I am satisfied that there was insufficient evidence of dumping of the said diaries to justify proceeding with the investigation.
