Tariff Concessions: New Arrangements

From 1 December 2012, the responsibility for administering New Zealand's tariff concessions will be transferred from the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) to the New Zealand Customs Service (Customs).

- Until **30 November**, enquiries, objections and applications for tariff concessions should continue to be lodged with MBIE.
- On **1 December**, outstanding applications and objections will be transferred to Customs and relevant applicants will be advised.
- From **1 December**, enquiries, objections and applications for tariff concessions should be lodged with Customs.
