Terms of Reference for the Local Government Commission Relating to the Draft Request for Proposal and Preferred Tender for the Provision of Regional Council Functions for the Chatham Islands Council

Proposal

The Local Government Commission ("the Commission") is required to consider, report on, and make recommendations in respect of matters relating to the Chatham Islands Council ("the Council") obtaining tenders for the delivery of its regional council functions.

Background

The Council has had significant financial difficulties for some time. The main reasons for the Council's financial position are: the wide range of functions the Council is required to undertake, the very small population base, and geographic isolation, which imposes significant additional costs for both the Council and its community.

The Government has agreed, in principle, to provide the Council with financial assistance, sufficient for the Council to meet the operating costs of all of its statutory responsibilities. The Council will be required to contract with a mainland local authority for the delivery of its regional council functions.

Process for Obtaining Tenders for Regional Council Functions

The process for the Council obtaining tenders for the delivery of its regional council functions shall be as follows:

- The Council will prepare a request for proposal to obtain tenders for the provision of regional council services on the Council's behalf, and will then forward the draft request for proposal to the Minister of Local Government and the Commission;
- The Commission will consider and report to the Minister of Local Government on the draft request for proposal to ensure that it would be in the interests of good local government;
- Once the Minister of Local Government has notified the Council that he is satisfied with the draft request for proposal, the Council will seek tenders from the relevant local authorities;
- 4. Once tenders are received, the Council will decide which is the preferred tender and will then forward the tender to the Commission;
- The Commission will report to the Minister of Local Government on whether the Council's decision on the preferred tender will be cost effective and will be in the interests of good local government;
- 6. The entering into of any contract between the Council and the preferred tenderer will be subject to the concurrence of the Minister of Local Government.

Specific Tasks for the Local Government Commission

Pursuant to section 31 (2) of the Local Government Act 2002, the Minister of Local Government requests the Commission to consider, report on, and make recommendations on:

- (a) The draft request for proposal for the provision of regional council functions to the Council to ensure that it is in the interests of good local government.
 - The report under (a) above, including recommendations, shall be provided to the Minister of Local Government within 10 working days of receipt of the draft request for proposal by the Commission from the Council.
- (b) Whether the Council's decision on its preferred tender for the provision of regional council functions will be cost effective and will be in the interests of good local government.

The report under (b) above, including recommendations, shall be provided to the Minister of Local Government within 20 working days of receipt of all relevant information relating to the preferred tender and other tenders by the Commission from the Council.

 - "special deposit" means a deposit held other than at call on behalf of the Crown, or any local authority within the meaning of the Local Government Act 1974;

"trust deposit" means a deposit held on trust:

- (i) for persons not of full age or capacity; or
- (ii) for beneficiaries not entitled to payment at call; or
- (iii) otherwise than at call (not being a special deposit).
- (2) Expressions defined in the Act have the same meaning in this notice as they do in the Act.
- **3. Rates of Common Fund interest**—(1) The rate of Common Fund interest payable on a deposit (other than an investment deposit repayable at the end of a fixed term) shall be that specified in Schedule 1 for the appropriate type of deposit.
- (2) The rate of Common Fund interest payable on an investment deposit repayable at the end of a fixed term shall be that specified in Schedule 2 for the appropriate term and dollar range.
- (3) Despite subparagraph (1), the rate of Common Fund interest payable on a deposit made pursuant to an enactment shall be the rate (if any) specified in the enactment.

- (4) Despite subparagraph (1), in particular cases or classes of case, Public Trust and the depositor may agree on a rate of interest payable on a special deposit that is different from the rate specified in Schedule 1 and the agreed rate then applies.
- 4. Revocation of notice and transitional provisions-

Programme

- 1. **Title**—This programme is the Social Rehabilitation Assistance Programme.
- 2. Commencement—This programme comes into effect on the day after the date on which the Minister approves it.
- **3. Purpose**—The purpose of this programme is to provide financial assistance to help people resident in approved residential social rehabilitation programmes to pay the cost of their treatment or care in those programmes.
- **4. Interpretation**—(1) In this programme, unless the context otherwise requires:

Act means the Social Security Act 1964

amount of benefit, in relation to a person, means:

- (a) in the case of an unmarried person, the amount of benefit payable to the person; or
- (b) in any other case, the proportion of the person's benefit payable to the person in accordance with section 83 of the Act
- **applicant** means a person who has made a written application for assistance under this programme or a person on whose behalf a written application for such assistance has been made

approved residential social rehabilitation programme means a residential programme set out in the Schedule, and **residential programme** has a corresponding meaning

social rehabilitation assistance or assistance means the assistance under clause 6.

- (2) Expressions otherwise defined in section 3 (1) of the Act have the meanings so defined.
- **5.** Application of the Social Security Act—(1) Sections 12, 62, 63, 74, 74A, 76, 77, 80A, 80BD (1), 81, 82 (1) and (4), and 84 of the Act apply to this programme and to any applicant and person granted assistance under it as if the assistance under it were a benefit.

- (2) Nothing in subclause (1) limits or affects the application of any other provision of the Act.
- **6. Social rehabilitation assistance**—(1) Subclause (2) applies to an applicant who is, for the time being:
 - (a) resident in an approved residential social rehabilitation programme; and
 - (b) eligible for and in receipt of an income-tested benefit under the Act or New Zealand superannuation or a veteran's pension.
- (2) The chief executive must grant social rehabilitation assistance to an applicant to whom this subclause applies if the chief executive is satisfied that:
 - (a) the applicant is required to contribute to the cost of the applicant's treatment or care in the residential programme; and
 - (b) the required contribution is greater than the amount of benefit payable to the applicant; and
 - (c) the applicant:
 - (i) is not receiving an accommodation supplement or a disability allowance or a special benefit under the Act; or
 - (ii) will, after the grant, be no longer receiving any benefit referred to in subparagraph (i); and
 - (d) in the case of an applicant receiving New Zealand superannuation or a veteran's pension, his or her income, including the income of the applicant's spouse and any New Zealand superannuation or veteran's pension payable to the applicant or the applicant's spouse, is such that the income less 6.47% of that income would not prevent payment of an invalid's benefit
- **7. Rate of assistance**—(1) The weekly amount of assistance payable to a person granted it must be fixed by the chief executive but must not exceed the total of:
 - (a) the appropriate maximum weekly amount set out in clause 3 of Part II of the Eighteenth Schedule of the Act; and
 - (b) the maximum weekly amount set out in clause 2 of the Nineteenth Schedule of the Act; and
 - (c) \$20 a week.
- (2) If any person granted assistance has, between the date the assistance commenced and the date of the grant, been paid any benefit referred to in clause 6 (2) (c) (i), the amount of assistance granted in respect of that period must be reduced by the amount of the benefit paid in that period.
- **8.** Commencement and ending of assistance—(1) The chief executive may commence assistance on any date (being a date on or after 1 July 2003) but not earlier than the date the applicant entered into residence under the residential programme.
- (2) Social rehabilitation assistance ends in accordance with section 80BD (1) of the Act.
- 9. Payment—The chief executive must make any payment of assistance to the provider of the residential programme on account of the person granted it.
- **10. Transitional provisions**—The chief executive may, as if the person had applied for it, grant social rehabilitation assistance to a person:
 - (a) who:
 - (i) was, immediately before the commencement of this programme, resident in a residential programme; and
 - (ii) was, before that date, receiving assistance toward the required contribution from one or more of an accommodation supplement, a disability allowance, or a special benefit under the Act; and
 - (b) whom the chief executive is satisfied will, after the grant, be no longer receiving any benefit referred to in paragraph (a) (ii).

Chairman's Report for the Year Ended 31 March 2003

The trust has experienced a year of extremely disappointing investment results to 31 March 2003, mainly due to the further significant decline in the value of the international equity investments held by the trust. Despite the trust's relatively conservative portfolio (69% invested in fixed interest securities), the large drop in value of the portion of the trust's investment in Global Equities (25.7% at 31 March 2003) gave rise to the trust showing a \$5.248 million loss before expenditure and donations.

The trustees have, under advice, not changed the strategic asset allocation. While the resolve of trustees has been tested by the above result, our advice and my belief is that the investment mix we have is still the most appropriate for long term growth and income flow within the objectives of this trust.

It appears the trustees' faith in the investment policy may be giving rise to appropriate results in the current year to date. Since the balance date, the international equities portion of the trust's investment portfolio has increased in value by approximately \$3.6 million in two months. We hope that this recovery is sustained and continues so that we will be clear of the concerns about poor returns and its negative impact on funds available for donations into our community. The balance of the trust's investment portfolio has continued to perform to expectation relative to the returns available on fixed interest securities and cash deposits.

We maintain a long-term perspective in our investment philosophy consistent with the nature of the community trust fund we administer. I have discussed the appropriateness of this with the Minister of Finance.

Your trustees have spent considerable time and effort developing a strategic plan for the trust this year and this will be posted on our web site shortly. We would welcome your input on its appropriateness and suggestions for improvement.

The strategic plan documents the philosophy of the trust. There is an element of change evolving in our policies. This is pursuant to our trustees' belief that we may be able to better enhance the well-being of the more deprived sections of our community by a change in our investment and donation policy. By working in liaison with other key stakeholders in our community, we may be able to identify some key community agreed initiatives which we can jointly fund to raise the economic prospect for those communities where the need is greatest. If we can achieve this, we will have the prospect of making a greater positive impact long term. We believe that to address deprivation, improved economic options and income flows need to be made available in those areas of need.

The Bay of Plenty population is continuing to grow at a rapid rate. The trust has, in the past, had a policy of building its capital by reserving out of income sufficient funds to maintain the real value of the trust's capital relative to both inflation and population growth within the Bay of Plenty. With reducing interest rates and long-term investment return expectations, this policy would appear to be unsustainable if the trust wishes to continue distributions to the community at reasonable and meaningful levels. Trustees have therefore decided to reduce our reserving policy in relation to population growth to 50% of the rate of increase instead of 100% as in the past.

During the past year, the trust has made donations of \$2,256,000.00. These donations have been made despite the loss experienced this year by using a further portion of reserves put aside in the past in anticipation of possible poor investment results.

Trustees have worked hard to help obtain additional funding for the *CoachForce* programme run by Sport Bay of Plenty. The hugely successful model is now in the process of being adopted nationwide through the regional sports trusts. The Bay of Plenty Community Trust has funded the programme fully for the last six years but needed to reduce its ongoing commitment. I am pleased to signal that this has been successful and the programme should be able to continue long term with the Bay of Plenty Community Trust providing half the external (non-sports) funding and Sport and Recreation New Zealand sourcing the balance

The trustees have considered ways to increase the capital of the trust. To this end, we have produced a brochure appealing to individuals to consider the trust as an appropriate beneficiary in their wills. A contribution to the trust would create a lasting legacy with security of knowledge that it will be appropriately targeted to enhance our community by responsible trustees from throughout the region with high levels of local knowledge and empathy. Our hope is that this trust will have an even greater positive impact on our community in the future and we commend this legacy option to you.

I thank fellow trustees for their excellent input to the trust. We have had two new appointments to the trust. Sandra Kai Fong from Rotorua and Enid Leighton from Whakatane replacing Egan Ogier from Tauranga and Kay Withers from Whakatane. Egan had been a trustee for eight years.

We acknowledge Egan's contribution. His wisdom and financial experience were very valuable to the trust. Kay Withers we thank also. She was an extremely competent trustee with excellent knowledge and skills who contributed in a very worthwhile manner to his community effort.

I also acknowledge the continuing excellent administration team at the trust office. Bruce Cronin and Cindy Currie run an efficient office with enthusiasm. This helps the trustees and the beneficiaries immensely.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2003

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

Reporting Entity

The trust is a charitable trust in accordance with the provisions of the Community Trusts Act 1999. The group consists of Bay of Plenty Community Trust Incorporated and its subsidiary Bay of Plenty Community Trust Charities Limited.

The financial statements have been prepared as required by the Community Trusts Act 1999 and the trust deed dated 17 August 2000 and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Act 1993.

Measurement Base

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of financial performance and financial position on an historical cost basis are followed by the group, with the exception of investments which are stated at market value as at 31 March 2003.

Specific Accounting Policies

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of financial performance and the financial position have been applied:

(a) Donations:

Donations made during the year from revenue are included in the income statement. Those made from trust capital have been included in the statement of movements in equity.

(b) Investments:

All investments are stated at assessed market value (refer note 5).

(c) Fixed assets:

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

(d) Depreciation:

Depreciation is charged to write off the cost of fixed assets over their expected economic lives using the diminishing value method at rates from 12% to 50% per annum.

(e) Accounts receivable:

Accounts receivable are recorded at their estimated realisable value.

(f) Financial instruments:

The trust includes all financial instrument arrangements in the balance sheet using the concept of accrual accounting. Financial instruments are valued as per Note 1, measurement base. These instruments arise as a result of everyday operations and include bank, accounts receivable, accounts payable and investments. Revenues and expenses in relation to all financial instruments are recognised in the statement of financial performance. Financial instruments are shown at their fair values.

(g) Consolidation.

The Bay of Plenty Community Trust and its subsidiary charitable company, Bay of Plenty Community Trust Charities Limited, have been consolidated using the purchase method of consolidation.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in previous years.

4. Financial Instruments

Investments are stated at market value as at balance date. Accrued interest, accounts payable and donations approved not yet paid are stated at the amounts expected to be received or paid. Accordingly, the trustees consider that the fair value of each class of financial assets and financial liabilities is the same as the carrying value in the financial position.

Concentration of Investments

Currency Risk

The trust incurs currency risk as a result of investment transactions entered into by fund managers. The trust has a policy of fully hedging global bonds and fifty percent (50%) hedging of global equities.

Interest Rate Risk

The following investments of the trust are sensitive to changes in interest rates: Bank call accounts and deposits, government and local authority securities, and securities held by fund managers.

Fair Value

The carrying value is considered to be the fair value for financial instruments.

5. Investments

The value of investments which are held in equities and fixed interest are subject to market fluctuations. The total investment portfolio is diversified in such a way that over time reductions in value in particular asset classes should be more than offset by increases in other classes. Investments are disclosed at market value at balance date and any gains (losses) arising from that treatment are shown as "Investment gains (losses)" in the statement of financial performance. Therefore, no provision has been made for potential gains or losses that could occur due to future market fluctuations. The investment portfolio as at 31 March 2003 is diversified as follows:

Notes to the Consolidated Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2003

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

1.1 Reporting Entity

Eastern and Central Community Trust Inc. is a charitable trust incorporated in accordance with the provisions of the Community Trusts Act 1999.

The trust has a wholly owned company – Eastern & Central Community Trust Charities Limited – which is registered under the Companies Act 1993.

The consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Act 1993.

1.2 Measurement Base

The measurement base applied is that of historical cost adjusted for the market valuation of investments.

1.3 Specific Accounting Policies

The following are the particular accounting policies which have a material effect on the measurement of results and financial position.

1.3.1 Basis of Consolidation

The consolidated financial statements include the trust and its wholly owned company accounted for using the purchase method. All significant inter-entity transactions are eliminated on consolidation. The entities have a common balance date of 31 March.

- **1.3.2 Investment Income** is accounted for on an accruals basis recognising both realised and unrealised gains or losses in value.
- **1.3.3 Foreign Currency** balances are converted to NZD at the year end rate of exchange unless covered by a forward exchange contract. Where such contracts are in place, the contracted rate is adopted. Transactions completed during the year are converted at the rate applying at the approximate date of the transaction. Foreign exchange gains and losses are included within the statement of financial performance.
- **1.3.4** Investments are recorded at market value at year-end.
- **1.3.5** Cash comprises cash at bank, call deposits and short-term deposits but does not include cash held by fund managers.
- **1.3.6 Donations** are recognised as a liability of the trust when they are approved by trustees and notified to applicants notwithstanding that the applicants may still have to fulfil some conditions.

1.3.7 Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

1.3.8 Depreciation is provided on a straight line basis on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to allocate the assets' cost less estimated residual value over their estimated useful lives.

The depreciation periods are:

Computer equipment three years
Fixtures and fittings nine years
Furniture ten years
Office equipment five years

- **1.3.9 Income tax** expense recognises the obligation payable to the Inland Revenue Department.
- **1.3.10** G.S.T. inclusive accounting has been adopted, as the trust is not registered for G.S.T.

1.4 Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been consistently applied.

In the previous year, the trustees made provision of \$193,770 for the likely tax payable on behalf of the beneficiaries in settlement with the Inland Revenue Department. No tax is payable this year as all applicants have presented an Inland Revenue letter of exemption from income tax.

4. Trust Capital

The initial trust capital was set at \$90,000,000 in 1997. The trust capital has been increased by a transfer of 3% of the opening capital base each year, as a surrogate for inflation and population growth within the region administered by the trust. The trustees periodically review the capital maintenance transfer and this year the trustees have determined not to increase the capital as previous transfers have exceeded inflation and population increases

The trust operates as a charitable trust distributing funds to the community in the central North Island region.

13. Financial Instruments

Financial instruments include short-term deposits, New Zealand bonds, international bonds, derivatives and investments in managed funds both within New Zealand and overseas.

13.1 Credit Risk

The trustees regularly review their investment strategy. The investment strategy ensures an appropriate diversification of investments so that the trust has no significant concentration of counterparty or credit risk.

13.2 Fair Values

The trust has recorded its financial assets and liabilities at current market values, which represent estimated fair values and credit risk exposure.

13.3 Currency Risk

The trust has exposure to currency risk through its investments in offshore equities and bonds. The current investment policy requires full hedging of currency risk for overseas bonds when held and 50% hedging of currency risk for overseas equities. Since October 2002, the trust has held a tactical hedging position with 100% cover on overseas equities. Currency risk is managed by fund managers with a range of tolerance.
