Continuing Professional Development Requirements for Holders of Certificates of Competence Granted Under the Health and Safety in Employment (Mining Operations and Quarrying Operations) Regulations 2016

Under Regulation 34(a)(ii) of the Health and Safety in Employment (Mining Operations and Quarrying Operations) Regulations 2016, WorkSafe New Zealand gives notice of the continuing education required to be completed for the granting of a renewal of a certificate of competence or the continuation of a certificate of competence for managers of quarrying operations or alluvial mining operations to which clause 7 of Schedule 1 of the Regulations applies.

Interpretation

In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires:

2013 Regulations means the Health and Safety in Employment (Mining Operations and Quarrying Operations) Regulations 2013.

Board means the New Zealand Mining Board of Examiners, established under clause 27 of Schedule 3 of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015.

certificate of competence (CoC) means a certificate of competence issued by the Board under Regulation 41 of the regulations.

competency means an area of learning as set out in column 1 of Table 1.

continuing professional development (CPD) means formal learning and informal learning in a range of topics that are:

- (a) within the competencies set out in column 1 of Table 1; and
- (b) directly relevant to maintaining and enhancing skills and knowledge within the extractives industry.

employed means employed as an employee or engaged as a contractor.

formal learning means learning of a type described in column 1 of the table in Part 1 of Appendix 1.

holder means a person who holds a certificate of competence and includes managers of quarrying operations or alluvial mining operations who hold a certificate of competence pursuant to clause 7 of Schedule 1 of the Regulations (which relates to lifetime holders of CoCs for managing quarrying operations or alluvial mining operations).

informal learning means learning of a type described in column 1 of the table in Part 2 of Appendix 1.

Regulations means the Health and Safety in Employment (Mining Operations and Quarrying Operations) Regulations 2016.

year means a twelve-month period commencing from the date the relevant certificate of competence was issued.

Commencement and Revocation

1. This notice comes into force on **19 August 2016**.
2. The Gazette notice, which came into force on 1 January 2016 (published in the [New Zealand Gazette, 10 December 2015, Issue No. 135, Notice No. 2015-au7201](#)) and previously set out the continuing education required to be completed for the granting of a renewal of a certificate of competence under the 2013 Regulations, is hereby revoked.

Continuing Professional Development Requirements

1. All holders must complete the CPD requirements in this notice regardless of whether or not they are employed within the extractives industry for the entire duration of the certificate of competence held.
2. Where a holder holds more than one certificate of competence within the same category, the holder is required only to complete the CPD requirements for the most senior certificate of competence held.
3. Where a holder holds certificates of competence in different categories, the following provisions apply:

- a. The holder is required to complete the number of hours of CPD over the five-year period for the most senior certificate of competence held, provided the requirements of subparagraph (b) are met;
 - b. The holder must meet the specific requirements for each certificate of competence as set out in column 3 of Table 2; and
 - c. CPD completed in relation to one certificate will be treated as completed in relation to another certificate so long as it is relevant to that other certificate.
4. A person who has had his or her certificate of competence suspended by the Board is not exempted from completing the CPD requirements.
 5. In this clause, the categories of certificate of competence are as follows:

CPD Requirements

1. Each holder must complete CPD in accordance with the requirements set out in Table 2 for the relevant certificate of competence.
2. For the purposes of Table 2, descriptions of the types of formal and informal learning and how many hours of each type of learning may be claimed are set out in Appendix 1.
3. If a holder completes more than the minimum hours of CPD required in a year, the holder may carry forward and attribute those hours into the next year. Hours may be carried forward even if the certificate of competence has been renewed. However, a holder may carry forward and attribute his or her hours to one year only.
4. Where a certificate of competence was issued prior to 1 January 2016, the number of hours of CPD required for the first year of the certificate and the total hours of CPD required for the duration of that certificate of competence is set out in Appendix 2.

 - i. consistent with current legislation, standards and codes of practice;
 - ii. current and relevant to the mining, tunnelling or quarrying industry (as applicable); and
 - iii. relevant to the holder, in relation to the certificate of competence held;
- c. have a clearly defined structure with a statement of course goals and outcomes, including learning objectives;
- d. have a learning environment which is appropriate, safe, supportive and adequately resourced;
- e. provide measureable outcomes for the knowledge and/or skills covered;
- f. have clear and valid processes of assessment to determine whether course attendees are deemed to have successfully completed the course; and
- g. have an instructor who:
 - i. has appropriate qualifications and technical and educational knowledge and experience relevant to the course he or she is delivering; and
 - ii. holds relevant qualifications or has suitable experience in adult education or training.

Recording CPD Activities

1. Each holder must:
 - a. record his or her CPD activities in a log book provided by WorkSafe New Zealand;
 - b. retain, for the duration of the certificate of competence held, evidence of all CPD activities undertaken during each five-year period; and
 - c. submit their CPD log book to the Board yearly on the anniversary of their CoC to show they have reached the yearly minimum requirement.
2. For the purposes of paragraph 1, **evidence** includes, but is not limited to, certificates, a list of results, records of attendance, employer reports, and receipts.
3. The log book will be used by the Board as evidence of whether the holder has complied with Regulation 43.

Rural School Turning Vehicle Hazard Variable Speed Limit—Oruaiti School and Woodhill School

Pursuant to clause 6.1 of the Land Transport Rule: Setting of Speed Limits 2003, clause 4.4(4) of the Land Transport Rule: Traffic Control Devices 2004, and a delegation from the NZ Transport Agency, I, Glenn Bunting, Network Manager, approve a variable speed limit at Oruaiti School and Woodhill School in accordance with the conditions set out in this notice:

Conditions

1. Variable Speed Limit

The NZ Transport Agency (Highway and Network Operations Group) may set a variable speed limit of 60km/h at a school listed in condition 2 of this notice to manage the safety of all road users when vehicles are turning at the

school, or when there is pedestrian or cycle activity on the road outside the school.

2. Location of Variable Speed Limit

A variable speed limit of 60km/h may be set at the following locations:

- a. State Highway 10 at Oruaiti School, Mangonui; and
- b. State Highway 16 at Woodhill School, Helensville.

3. Length of Variable Speed Limit

The variable speed limit on the road on which the school is located must be a minimum length of 300m, but must not be longer than 750m.

Speed limit signs that comply with the Land Transport Rule: Traffic Control Devices 2004 must be installed to identify the section of road subject to the variable speed limit as follows:

- a. At least one R1-2.1, Option B “Variable speed” sign installed above a W16-5.1 “School” supplementary warning sign, at the beginning of the variable speed limit on the road outside the school, facing road users on each approach to the school; and
- b. R1-1 “Standard”, R1-1.1 “100km/h” or R1-3 “Derestriction” signs at the end of the variable speed limit, facing road users leaving the school, to indicate the permanent speed limit that applies beyond that point.

6. Bylaw

Within the designated area defined above, the following conditions and requirements apply:

 - a. A restricted area of 60 metres around any warships at anchor in the designated Hauraki Gulf anchorages.
 - b. A restricted area of 60 metres around any warships at anchor in the Waitemata Harbour.
2. Downtown Auckland Restricted Areas
 - a. Wynyard Wharf extending 60 metres (from the face of the berth or from outboard of any vessel berthed alongside) east towards Queens Wharf as well as extending 60 metres north from the northern end of Wynyard Wharf.
 - b. The Western side of Queens Wharf extending 60 metres (from the face of the berth or from outboard of any vessel berthed alongside) west as well as extending 60 metres north from the northern end of Queens Wharf.
 - c. Downtown Ferry Terminal Basin between Princes Wharf and Queens Wharf and extending 60 metres north from the northern end of each wharf.
 - d. The area of water known as the ferry basin comprises the entire water space between Princes and Queens Wharf. This is a restricted area and access to this area will only be granted to specifically authorised commercial vessel traffic and or any other specific vessel authorised by the harbourmaster.
3. Commercial Wharf Area (Ports of Auckland Limited) Restricted Areas
 - a. The navigable waters south of a line from the northern-most point of Ferguson Wharf extending to the most northern point of Queens Wharf is a restricted area and only vessels authorised by the Ports of Auckland Limited Port Facilities Security Manager and/or the harbourmaster may enter this area.
4. Devonport Naval Base Restricted Area
 - a. The navigable water adjacent to the Devonport Naval Base and defined as “Defence Area” is a restricted area and vessels are to keep at least 200 metres clear unless authorised otherwise by the Royal New Zealand Navy.
5. Auckland Harbour Speed restriction: Auckland Council Navigation Safety Bylaw 2014, Clause 60.
 - a. The 12 knot speed restriction which currently exists as defined by the Auckland Council Navigation Safety Bylaw Clause 60 must be complied with.
6. Duties of masters of vessels under 500 gross tonnage: Auckland Council Navigation Safety Bylaw 2014, Clause 54 is to apply at all times.
 - a. The person in charge of a vessel under 500 gross tonnage must not allow their vessel to impede the navigation of any large vessel if the vessels are in the pilotage area.
7. Moving Prohibited Zone: Auckland Council Navigation Safety Bylaw 2014, Clause 55 is to apply at all times:
 - a. A moving prohibited zone extending to 100 metres astern and 100 metres to each side of a large vessel, and continuing at such width to 500 metres ahead, following the line of the buoyed channel when changing course, is reserved around a large vessel when that large vessel is underway within the

pilotage areas of Auckland.

- b. When navigating within a marked channel, the moving prohibited zone to the side of the large vessel is reduced to the width of the marked channel and the zone ahead of the large vessel must follow the line of the marked channel.
 - c. The owner or person in charge of a vessel must not navigate the vessel within the moving prohibited zone of a large vessel, within the pilotage area of Auckland.
 - d. For the purpose of this clause, a tug and barge is considered a composite unit.
8. No person may jump, dive or swim from any wharf or structure within the permit area, other than for the purposes of saving another person's life or unless authorised by the harbourmaster or a member of the New Zealand Police holding the powers of a constable.

Additional Restrictions

All vessels must comply with any temporary restrictions or directions issued by the Auckland Harbourmaster. Temporary restrictions or directions will be advertised on Marine Channel 12 every hour for the period they are in force. The first broadcast will occur as soon as practical and then every hour at approximately 15 minutes past the hour. In addition, advice to vessels to listen to these broadcasts will be transmitted on marine VHF channel 16, just prior to detailed broadcast on marine VHF channel 12.

From time to time, further specific areas that are determined as being necessary to restrict access to will be clearly marked. This will be by the positioning of appropriate harbourmaster special mark inflatable buoys.

Proposed Hours of Operation

Medicines (Designated Prescriber - Registered Nurses) Notice 2016

Pursuant to sections 105 and 105B of the Medicines Act 1981 and the Medicines (Designated Prescriber - Registered Nurses) Regulations 2016, the Nursing Council of New Zealand ("Council") gives the following notice.

Notice

1. Title and commencement—This notice is the Medicines (Designated Prescriber - Registered Nurses) Notice 2016 and comes into force on **20 September 2016**.

2. Purpose—The Schedule to this notice sets out the requirements that the Council has determined must be met by registered nurses practising in collaborative primary health and specialty teams who wish to prescribe specified prescription medicine (A1). These requirements are imposed under Regulation 5 of the Medicines (Designated Prescriber - Registered Nurses) Regulations 2016. The Schedule also sets out the requirements for registered nurses practising in diabetes health who wish to prescribe specified prescription medicines (A2). The requirements for prescribing in diabetes health will commence on 30 November 2016 and will be revoked on 30 November 2017. After this time all registered nurses will be required to meet the requirements in (A1) for prescribing.

Schedule

A. Requirements for Prescribing (Regulation 6)

1. The Council requirements for education and training that registered nurses must complete before commencing to prescribe for the first time in primary health and specialty teams are as follows:

- a. A minimum of three years' full-time equivalent practice in the area they intend to prescribe with at least one year of the total practice in New Zealand or a similar healthcare context;
- b. the completion of a Council-approved postgraduate diploma in registered nurse prescribing for long-term and common conditions or equivalent as assessed by the Council;
- c. completion of a practicum with an authorised prescriber, which demonstrates knowledge to safely prescribe specified prescription medicines and knowledge of the regulatory framework for prescribing; and
- d. a satisfactory assessment of the competencies for nurse prescribers completed by an authorised prescriber.

2. The Council requirements for education and training that registered nurses must undertake before commencing to prescribe for the first time in diabetes health are as follows:

- a. The completion of two Level 8 papers or equivalent, as assessed by the Council. The papers must include the following content: pathophysiology, clinical assessment and decision making, and pharmacology;
- b. demonstration of a clear understanding of diabetes disease processes at Level 8, or equivalent, as determined by the Council; and
- c. completion of a six- to 12-week practicum with the authorised prescriber supervising the prescribing, which demonstrates knowledge to safely prescribe all specified diabetes medicines and knowledge of the regulatory framework for prescribing.

B. Other Training to be Undertaken (Regulation 7)

Registered nurses who prescribe must undertake:

- a. sixty hours of professional development every three years of which twenty hours must be related to prescribing; and
- b. forty days of prescribing practice per year.

C. Continuing Competence (Regulation 8)

Registered nurses authorised to prescribe must provide to the Council each year, with their application for a practising certificate, evidence that they have maintained their prescribing competence.

Explanatory note

Introduction

Under the Medicines (Designated Prescriber - Registered Nurses) Regulations 2016 made under the Medicines Act 1981, the Nursing Council of New Zealand ("Council") may set qualifications, training and assessment requirements for registered nurses commencing to prescribe for the first time and other training and assessments to be completed at specified times. These are outlined in the notice titled Medicines (Designated Prescriber - Registered Nurses) Notice 2016, published in the [New Zealand Gazette, 18 August 2016, Issue No. 72, Notice No. 2016-gs4683](#).

Under sections 11(2) and 12 the Health Practitioners Competence Assurance Act 2003, the Nursing Council of New Zealand is required to describe the scopes of practice for nursing in New Zealand and prescribe the qualifications for each scope of practice.

Changes coming into effect on 20 September 2016

In February 2013, the Council proposed that some suitably qualified and experienced registered nurses working in primary health and specialist teams be able to prescribe some prescription medicines. Previously prescribing was restricted to suitably qualified nurses in diabetes health.

The Council sought the views of stakeholders, including nurses, nurse practitioners, nursing organisations, medical organisations, pharmacist organisations, regulatory authorities and PHARMAC, district health boards, primary health organisations, Māori and Pacific health providers, and consumer groups. The consultation document was also available on the Council website for public comment. One hundred and ninety seven submissions were received with the majority in favour of this proposal. In October 2014, the Council applied to the Ministry of Health for designated prescribing rights for registered nurses practising in primary health and specialty teams. The proposal was agreed to by the Government in November 2015 and the Medicines (Designated Prescriber - Registered Nurses) Regulations 2016 and Misuse of Drugs Amendment Regulations 2016 were made by the Executive Council in June 2016.

The Council is also amending the scope of practice to allow some registered nurses to prescribe prescription medicines and including the education and training requirements for registered nurses prescribing in primary health and specialty teams as additional prescribed qualifications for registered nurses. This means that the Council is able to approve and monitor these programmes under section 12 of the Health Practitioners Competence Assurance Act 2003 and aligns the scope of practice and prescribed qualifications for registered nurses with the requirements of the Medicines (Designated Prescriber - Registered Nurses) Regulations 2016.

When registered nurses apply to the Council and meet the requirements to prescribe for the first time a condition/authorisation will be included in their scope of practice, on their practising certificates and the public register (on the Council's website) to specify that they may prescribe within primary health and specialty teams.

The Medicines (Designated Prescriber - Registered Nurses practising in Diabetes Health) Regulations 2011 will be revoked on 30 November 2016. Registered nurses authorised to prescribe in diabetes health will be notified that they are authorised under the new regulation from 30 November 2016 and continue to have a condition in

their scope of practice stating their specific area of practice (diabetes health) and that they must practise under the supervision of a medical practitioner. The Council has included registered nurses prescribing in diabetes health in the notice under the Medicines (Designated Prescriber - Registered Nurses) Regulations 2016 so that nurses who have commenced this qualification may continue to be authorised to prescribe for a period of 12 months (until 30 November 2017).

In August 2016, the Council will notify registered nurses prescribing in diabetes health affected by these changes and include information on its website.

Previous notices

The Council last published the scope of practice and prescribed qualifications for registered nurses in July 2015. The Council also published one notice under the Medicines (Designated Prescriber - Registered nurses practising in diabetes health) Regulation 2011. This Regulation will be revoked on 30 November 2016.

Scope of Practice—Registered Nurses

Registered nurses utilise nursing knowledge and complex nursing judgment to assess health needs and provide care, and to advise and support people to manage their health. They practise independently and in collaboration with other health professionals, perform general nursing functions, and delegate to and direct enrolled nurses, health care assistants and others. They provide comprehensive assessments to develop, implement, and evaluate an integrated plan of health care, and provide interventions that require substantial scientific and professional knowledge, skills and clinical decision making. This occurs in a range of settings in partnership with individuals, families, whānau and communities. Registered nurses may practise in a variety of clinical contexts depending on their educational preparation and practice experience. Registered nurses may also use this expertise to manage, teach, evaluate and research nursing practice. Registered nurses are accountable for ensuring all health services they provide are consistent with their education and assessed competence, meet legislative requirements and are supported by appropriate standards. There will be conditions placed in the scope of practice of some registered nurses according to their qualifications or experience limiting them to a specific area of practice. Some nurses who have completed the required additional experience, education and training will be authorised by the Council to prescribe some medicines within their competence and area of practice.

The Nursing Council Competencies for Registered Nurses describe the skills and activities of registered nurses.

Prescribed Qualifications

New Zealand Graduates

- a. A bachelor's degree in nursing approved by the Nursing Council of New Zealand; or
- b. a graduate nursing qualification at Level 7 on the New Zealand Qualifications Framework approved by the Nursing Council of New Zealand; or
- c. a postgraduate nursing qualification at Level 8 on the New Zealand Qualifications Framework approved by the Nursing Council of New Zealand; and
- d. a pass in an assessment of Nursing Council Competencies for Registered Nurses by an approved provider; and
- e. a pass in an Examination for Registered Nurses set by the Nursing Council of New Zealand.

Registered Nurses from Overseas

- a. Current registration with an overseas regulatory authority; and
- b. successful completion of a nursing programme that is, in the Nursing Council's opinion, equivalent to or as satisfactory as a bachelor's degree programme in nursing at Level 7 on the New Zealand Qualifications Framework; or
- c. successful completion of a graduate pre-registration nursing programme that is, in the Nursing Council's

- opinion, equivalent to or as satisfactory as an approved New Zealand graduate nursing programme at Level 7 on the New Zealand Qualifications Framework that leads to registration in the registered nurse scope of practice; or
- d. successful completion of a postgraduate pre-registration nursing programme that is, in the Nursing Council's opinion, equivalent to or as satisfactory as an approved New Zealand postgraduate nursing programme at Level 8 on the New Zealand Qualifications Framework that leads to registration in the registered nurse scope of practice; and
 - e. two years' post-registration nursing practice as a registered nurse of at least 2,500 hours within the five years immediately preceding the date of the application; and
 - f. at the direction of the Nursing Council, successful completion of a Nursing Council approved competence assessment programme.

Additional qualifications for registered nurses who wish to prescribe in primary health and specialty teams

- a. A minimum of three years full-time equivalent practice in the area they intend to prescribe in with at least one year of the total practice in New Zealand or a similar healthcare context;
- b. the completion of a Council-approved postgraduate diploma in registered nurse prescribing for long-term and common conditions or equivalent as assessed by the Council, including
- c. a practicum with an authorised prescriber, which demonstrates knowledge to safely prescribe specified prescription medicines and knowledge of the regulatory framework for prescribing; and
- d. satisfactory assessment of the competencies for nurse prescribers completed by an authorised prescriber.
