specified processing error for a person, means incorrect data relating to either or both of the type of the person's premises and the person's accommodation costs (within the meaning of section 61E of the Act) being entered:

- (a) into a computer system operated by or on behalf of the department;
- (b) as a result of a system error; and
- (c) at any time in the years 1993 to 2014 (inclusive).

(3) After clause 2.1, insert:

2.1A For the period of 12 months after the payment was received, a person's **chargeable income** does not include:

- (a) the amount of any lump sum payment of arrears of accommodation supplement made to the person, on or after 1 November 2016, and as a result of the department correcting a specified processing error; or
- (b) any income derived in that period by the person from a payment referred to in paragraph (a).

Digital modulation schemes are permitted with a maximum necessary bandwidth of 200 kHz. Use of a power level above -20 dBW is only permitted when the user has first determined that the intended use will not affect the reception of television broadcasts in or adjacent to the proposed area of operation.

6. General conditions applying to all transmissions under this licence—

1. The frequency ranges, peak power of transmissions within those frequency ranges, and designated uses of frequencies are those prescribed in this licence. All transmissions in a given frequency range must comply with any special conditions relating to that frequency range.
2. Transmitters, and persons supplying or using transmitters, must comply with the requirements of Regulations 32-37 of the Radiocommunications Regulations 2001.
3. Frequency use is on a shared basis and the chief executive does not accept liability under any circumstances for any loss or damage of any kind occasioned by the unavailability of frequencies or interference to reception.
4. Should interference occur to services licensed pursuant to a radio licence or a spectrum licence, the chief executive reserves the right to require and ensure that any transmission or any emission pursuant to this General User Radio Licence change frequency, reduce power, or cease operation.
5. Transmissions that are broadcasting, as defined in the Broadcasting Act 1989, are not permitted.

This is a restricted area and access to this area will only be granted to specifically authorised commercial vessel traffic and or any other specific vessel authorised by the Harbourmaster.
3. Commercial Wharf Area (Ports of Auckland Limited) Restricted Areas:
 - a. The navigable waters south of a line from the northern most point of Ferguson Wharf extending to the most northern point of Queens Wharf is a restricted area and only vessels authorised by the Ports of Auckland Limited Port Facilities Security Manager and or the Harbourmaster may enter this area.

4. Devonport Naval Base Restricted Area:
 - a. The navigable water adjacent the Devonport Naval base and defined as “Defence Area” is a restricted area and vessels are to keep at least 200 metres clear unless authorised otherwise by the Royal New Zealand Navy.
5. Auckland Harbour Speed restriction; Auckland Council Navigation Safety Bylaw 2014, Clause 60:
 - a. The 12-knot speed restriction which currently exists as defined by the Auckland Council Navigation Safety Bylaw Clause 60 must be complied with.
6. Duties of masters of vessels under 500 gross tonnage; Auckland Council Navigation Safety Bylaw 2014, Clause 54 is to apply at all times:
 - a. The person in charge of a vessel under 500 gross tonnage must not allow their vessel to impede the navigation of any large vessel if the vessels are in the pilotage area.
7. Moving Prohibited Zone: Auckland Council Navigation Safety Bylaw 2014, Clause 55 is to apply at all times:
 - a. A moving prohibited zone extending to 100 metres astern and 100 metres to each side of a large vessel, and continuing at such width to 500 metres ahead, following the line of the buoyed channel when changing course, is reserved around a large vessel, when that large vessel is underway within the pilotage areas of Auckland.
 - b. When navigating within a marked channel, the moving prohibited zone to the side of the large vessel is reduced to the width of the marked channel and the zone ahead of the large vessel must follow the line of the marked channel.
 - c. The owner or person in charge of a vessel must not navigate the vessel within the moving prohibited zone of a large vessel, within the pilotage area of Auckland.
 - d. For the purpose of this clause, a tug and barge is considered a composite unit.
8. No person may jump, dive or swim from any wharf or structure within the permit area, other than for the purposes of saving another person’s life or unless authorised by the Harbourmaster or a member of the New Zealand Police holding the powers of a constable.

Additional Restrictions

All vessels must comply with any temporary restrictions or directions issued by the Auckland Harbourmaster. Temporary restrictions or directions will be advertised on Marine Channel 12 every hour for the period they are in force. The first broadcast will occur as soon as practical and then every hour at approximately 15 minutes past the hour. In addition, advice to vessels to listen to these broadcasts will be transmitted on marine VHF channel 16, just prior to detailed broadcast on marine VHF channel 12.

Hours of Operation

General Section

Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (Plumbing Registration and Licensing) Notice 2016

Pursuant to sections 28 and 30 of the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Act 2006 (“Act”), the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (“Board”) designates the following classes of registration for sanitary plumbing and prescribes the following matters relating to plumbing registration and licensing.

Notice

1. Title—This notice is the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (Plumbing Registration and Licensing) Notice 2016.

2. Commencement—This notice comes into force on **6 December 2016**.

3. Revocation—This notice revokes the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (Plumbing Registration and Licensing) Notice 2010 (published in the [New Zealand Gazette, 21 October 2010, No. 143, page 3611](#)).

Part A - Certifying plumber

4. Certifying plumber

The Board designates the certifying plumber class of plumbing registration.

5. Authorised work

A certifying plumber who holds a current annual practising licence issued by the Board:

- (a) may carry out sanitary plumbing;
- (b) may supervise sanitary plumbing undertaken by the following people:
 - (i) tradesmen plumbers;
 - (ii) journeymen plumbers;
 - (iii) holders of provisional licences to do or assist in doing sanitary plumbing pursuant to section 38 of the Act;
 - (iv) trainee plumbers who hold limited certificates to do or assist in doing sanitary plumbing pursuant to section 14 of the Act (“Trainee Plumbers”); and
 - (v) persons doing or assisting in doing sanitary plumbing pursuant to section 19 of the Act (“Exempt Persons”);
- (c) may test sanitary plumbing; and
- (d) must verify sanitary plumbing where verification is required.

6. Minimum standards for registration

Registration requirements

(1) To be registered as a certifying plumber a person must have:

(a) held a licence as a licensed or tradesman plumber (or registered plumber under the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Act 1976) for an aggregate period of not less than 24 months under the supervision of a certifying plumber (or a craftsman plumber under the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Act 1976), and passed the examination specified in paragraph 6(2) below; or

(b) where applying on the basis of an overseas plumbing qualification:

(i) submitted a completed pre-registration application form to the Board that includes the following documentation:

A. an international qualifications assessment report from the New Zealand Qualifications Authority concluding that the applicant’s plumbing qualification is equivalent to, or greater than level 4 on the National Qualifications Framework;

B. unless the applicant has already been granted New Zealand residence, police certificates that are no older than six months from the applicant’s country of citizenship (unless they can provide satisfactory evidence they have never lived there), and from any country the applicant has lived in for 12 months or more (whether in one visit or intermittently) in the last 10 years, that the Board assesses as meeting its fit and proper person requirements; and

- C. evidence that the applicant has worked full-time in the plumbing trade for six years or more; and
(ii) passed the Board's plumbing advanced proficiency assessment (this practical assessment must be undertaken in New Zealand).

Certifying plumber competencies

(2) The examination a person must pass in order to register as a certifying plumber is Examination 9195 set by the Board.

(3) Examination 9195 will be set by the Board so that, in order to pass the examination, the applicant must demonstrate the ability to design, manage the installation of, and verify sanitary plumbing systems through possessing competencies in the areas of:

(a) Trade calculations and trade science used in the design and installation of sanitary plumbing systems. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) estimation, measurement, and calculation using management systems;
- (ii) application of formulae including transposing;
- (iii) laws of physics and their application as they relate to sanitary plumbing;
- (iv) hydraulic principles;
- (v) expansion and contraction;
- (vi) corrosion protection;
- (vii) water quality;
- (viii) density; and
- (ix) energy transfer.

(b) The selection of materials, their properties, applications, and how they are used in the design and specification of sanitary plumbing systems. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) compatibility, testing, and commissioning procedures; and
- (ii) alternative materials, approval regimes, and protection of material.

(c) The drawings and specifications for sanitary plumbing. Descriptors include, but are not limited to, the preparation of plans and specifications.

(d) The design, specification, and verification of water services for sanitary plumbing systems. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) pipe sizing principles;
- (ii) hot and cold water reticulation systems;
- (iii) water storage systems;
- (iv) domestic fire sprinkler systems;
- (v) rain water harvesting;
- (vi) pumps;
- (vii) sanitary appliances and fixtures;
- (viii) backflow prevention;
- (ix) heating systems that relate to sanitary plumbing, including hot water systems, and solar water heating; and
- (x) alternative water supplies.

(e) The design and specification of foul water systems for sanitary plumbing. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) principles of sizing and venting for foul water plumbing systems;
- (ii) pumps;
- (iii) sanitary appliances and fixtures;
- (iv) backflow prevention; and
- (v) irrigation systems.

(f) The ability to access and apply relevant documentation relating to sanitary plumbing to meet compliance requirements, and an understanding of the regulatory environment. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) Acts and regulations;
- (ii) standards;
- (iii) codes; and
- (iv) manufacturers' instructions.

(g) Management of the effect on the integrity of structures relating to the design and installation of sanitary plumbing systems, including weather tightness considerations as they relate to penetrations to the building envelope and the coordination with other services. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) preservation of structural integrity;
- (ii) prevention of damage to property including weather tightness; and
- (iii) positioning and protection of services along with the coordination with other building services.

(h) Responsibilities relating to managing health and safety. Descriptors include, but are not limited to, health and safety systems, and the preparation of safety plans.

(i) Responsibilities relating to the supervision of persons who do, or assist in doing, sanitary plumbing.

Transitional provisions

(4) Any person who, at 4 July 2013, had passed Examination 9195 but has not passed the certifying common Examination 9194 that a person was required to pass from 1 April 2010 to 3 July 2013 is required to successfully complete one or more competence programmes focused on assessing the competencies previously covered in Examination 9194, as directed by the Registrar, before that person will be considered to meet the minimum standards for registration as a certifying plumber.

(5) Any person who, at 4 July 2013, has passed Examination 9194, that a person was required to pass from 1 April 2010 to 3 July 2013, but not Examination 9195, is required to pass Examination 9195 before that person will be considered to meet the minimum standards for registration as a certifying plumber.

7. Terms and conditions of registration

(1) A certifying plumber must pay any monies owing to the Board as they become due, subject to any exceptions agreed to by the Board.

(2) A certifying plumber must provide the Board with all information required for the public register.

8. Terms and conditions of licence

Continuing professional development

(1) For the purposes of paragraph (2) below:

Approved continuing professional development course means a course of training of up to six hours duration on continuing professional development topics as set out on the Board's website and delivered by an approved provider either in person or online.

Approved provider means a provider approved by the Board to deliver an approved continuing professional development course and notified on the Board's website.

(2) To be eligible to renew their annual practising licence, all certifying plumbers applying to renew their licence for the licensing years beginning on 1 April 2017 and beyond must satisfy the Registrar that they have completed any approved continuing professional development course that has been notified as applying in the 12 month period prior to renewal.

Authorisation card

(3) All certifying plumbers that hold a current annual practising licence are issued with an authorisation card by the Board.

(4) At all times when undertaking sanitary plumbing, a certifying plumber must be able to produce their authorisation card on demand.

Supervision

(5) A certifying plumber must pay the prescribed fee for, and notify the Board of the name, address and telephone number of, every Exempt Person working under their supervision.

(6) A certifying plumber must notify the Board in writing if their supervision of any person ceases.

(7) A certifying plumber remains responsible for all sanitary plumbing undertaken by a person under their supervision until the Board has received written notification from them that they are no longer supervising that person.

(8) A certifying plumber must ensure that sanitary plumbing undertaken by persons under their supervision:

- (a) is performed competently;

(b) is subject to appropriate safety measures; and

(c) complies with the requirements of all relevant regulations, including regulations made under the Building Act 2004.

(9) A certifying plumber must ensure that all persons under their supervision:

(a) are competent to perform the tasks undertaken;

(b) are adequately supervised while carrying out sanitary plumbing;

(c) comply with all relevant regulations, including regulations made under the Building Act 2004; and

(d) can produce their current authorisation card issued by the Board on demand.

(10) A certifying plumber may nominate another currently licensed certifying plumber or tradesman plumber ("Nominated Person") to provide physical supervision of any person working under their supervision.

(11) A certifying plumber remains responsible at all times for all aspects of the work done by a person under their supervision even where they have nominated another certifying plumber or tradesman plumber to provide physical supervision of that work.

(12) A certifying plumber who is nominated to provide physical supervision of a person must promptly notify the person's supervising certifying plumber of any concerns they have about the work done by that person or the safety measures in place in respect of the work done by that person.

(13) A certifying plumber must ensure that, during the first 12 months of holding a limited certificate to do or assist in doing sanitary plumbing, a Trainee Plumber under their supervision works at all times in their presence or in the presence of a Nominated Person.

(14) A certifying plumber must ensure that, during the first 24 months of doing or assisting in doing sanitary plumbing under an exemption under section 19 of the Act, an Exempt Person under their supervision works at all times in their presence or in the presence of a Nominated Person.

Part B - Tradesman plumber

9. Tradesman plumber

(1) The Board designates the tradesman plumber class of plumbing registration.

(2) All plumbers registered as licensed plumbers under the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (Plumbing Registration and Licensing) Notice 2010 are now deemed to be registered as tradesmen plumbers.

10. Authorised work

A tradesman plumber who holds a current annual practising licence issued by the Board:

(a) may carry out sanitary plumbing under the supervision of a certifying plumber;

(b) may physically supervise, as a Nominated Person, sanitary plumbing undertaken by a person under supervision; and

(c) may test sanitary plumbing.

11. Minimum standards for registration

Registration requirements

(1) To be registered as a tradesman plumber a person must have:

(a) obtained the National Certificate in Plumbing and passed the examination specified in paragraph 11(2) below; or

(b) where the person is applying on the basis of an overseas plumbing qualification:

(i) submitted a completed pre-registration application form to the Board that includes the following documentation:

A. an international qualifications assessment report from the New Zealand Qualifications Authority concluding that the applicant's plumbing qualification is equivalent to, or greater than level 4 on the National Qualifications Framework;

B. unless the applicant has already been granted New Zealand residence, police certificates that are no older than six months from the applicant's country of citizenship (unless they can provide satisfactory evidence they have never lived there), and from any country the applicant has lived in for 12 months or more (whether in one visit or intermittently) in the last 10 years, that the Board assesses as meeting its fit and proper person registration requirements; and

C. evidence that the applicant has worked full-time in the plumbing trade for four years or more; and

(ii) passed the examination specified in paragraph 11(2) below, which they may sit in their home country by arrangement with the Board.

Tradesman plumber competencies

(2) The examination a person must pass in order to register as a tradesman plumber is Examination 9192 set by the Board.

(3) Examination 9192 will be set by the Board so that, to pass the examination an applicant demonstrates knowledge, and the experience and practical ability to install, test, commission, fault-find, and maintain sanitary plumbing systems through possessing competencies in the areas of:

(a) Trade calculations and trade sciences. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) estimation, measurement, and calculation using measurement systems;
- (ii) application of formulae;
- (iii) laws of physics and their application as they relate to sanitary plumbing;
- (iv) hydraulic principles;
- (v) expansion and contraction;
- (vi) corrosion protection;
- (vii) water quality;
- (viii) density; and
- (ix) energy transfer.

(b) Limitations in and the application of material used in sanitary plumbing, including material protection and jointing methods. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) copper;
- (ii) polyvinylchloride (PVC);
- (iii) polybutylene (PB);
- (iv) polyethylene (PE);
- (v) mild steel;
- (vi) stainless steel;
- (vii) acrylonitrile butadiene styrene (ABS);
- (viii) polypropylene;
- (ix) cross-linked polyethylene;
- (x) brass/bronze;
- (xi) cast iron;
- (xii) sheet metal;
- (xiii) lead;
- (xiv) glass; and
- (xv) the use of tools and equipment.

(c) Drawings and specifications for sanitary plumbing. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) interpreting plans and specifications;
- (ii) drawing as-built plans; and
- (iii) development of patterns.

(d) The installation, testing, commissioning, fault-finding and maintenance of water services for sanitary plumbing. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) pipe sizing principles;
- (ii) hot and cold water reticulation systems;
- (iii) water storage systems;
- (iv) domestic fire sprinkler systems;
- (v) rainwater harvesting;
- (vi) pumps;
- (vii) sanitary appliances and fixtures;
- (viii) backflow prevention;

(ix) heating systems that relate to sanitary plumbing, including hot water systems, and solar water heating; and

(x) alternative water supplies.

(e) The installation, testing, commissioning, fault-finding and maintenance of foul water systems for sanitary plumbing systems. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

(i) principles of sizing and venting for foul water plumbing systems;

(ii) pumps;

(iii) sanitary appliances and fixtures;

(iv) backflow prevention; and

(v) irrigation systems.

(f) The ability to access and apply relevant documentation relating to sanitary plumbing to meet compliance requirements, and an understanding of the regulatory environment. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

(i) Acts and regulations;

(ii) standards;

(iii) codes; and

(iv) manufacturers' instructions.

(g) The effect of the installation of sanitary plumbing systems, or their components, on the integrity of structures, including weather tightness considerations as they relate to penetrations of the building envelope. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

(i) preservation of structural integrity; and

(ii) prevention of damage to property including weather tightness.

(h) Responsibilities relating to health and safety. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

(i) personal and public safety;

(ii) site safety;

(iii) electrical safety; and

(iv) environmental considerations.

(i) Limitations on persons who do, or assist in doing, sanitary plumbing.

Transitional provision

(4) Any person who was approved under the Board's Immigrant Qualification Assessment System prior to 4 July 2013 must pass Examination 9192 before that person will be considered to meet the minimum standards for registration as a tradesman plumber.

12. Terms and conditions of registration

(1) A tradesman plumber must pay any monies owing to the Board as they become due, subject to any exceptions agreed to by the Board.

(2) A tradesman plumber must provide the Board with all information required for the public register.

13. Terms and conditions of licence

Continuing professional development

(1) For the purposes of paragraph (2) below:

Approved continuing professional development course means a course of training of up to six hours duration on continuing professional development topics as set out on the Board's website and delivered by an approved provider either in person or online.

Approved provider means a provider approved by the Board to deliver an approved continuing professional development course and notified on the Board's website.

(2) To be eligible to renew their annual practising licence, all tradesmen plumbers applying to renew their licence for the licensing years beginning on 1 April 2017 and beyond must satisfy the Registrar that they have completed any approved continuing professional development course that has been notified as applying in the 12 month period prior to renewal.

Authorisation card

(3) All tradesmen plumbers that hold a current annual practising licence are issued with an authorisation card by

the Board.

(4) At all times when undertaking sanitary plumbing, a tradesmen plumber must be able to produce their authorisation card on demand.

Supervision

(5) A tradesman plumber must work at all times under the supervision of a certifying plumber.

(6) A tradesman plumber must notify the Board of the name and registration number of their supervising certifying plumber.

(7) A tradesman plumber who is nominated to provide physical supervision of a person must promptly notify the person's supervising certifying plumber of any concerns they have about the competency of the work done by that person or the safety measures in place in respect of the work done by that person.

Part C - Journeyman plumber

14. Journeyman plumber

The Board designates the journeyman plumber class of plumbing registration.

15. Authorised work

A journeyman plumber who holds a current annual practising licence issued by the Board:

- (a) may carry out sanitary plumbing under the supervision of a certifying plumber; and
- (b) may test sanitary plumbing.

16. Minimum standards for registration

To be registered as a journeyman plumber a person must have successfully completed one of the following:

- (a) the National Certificate in Plumbing;
- (b) the third stage block course in plumbing; or
- (c) the practice trade certificate in plumbing.

17. Terms and conditions of registration

(1) A journeyman plumber must pay any monies owing to the Board as they become due, subject to any exceptions agreed to by the Board.

(2) A journeyman plumber must provide the Board with all information required for the public register.

18. Terms and conditions of licence

Continuing professional development

(1) For the purposes of paragraph (2) below:

Approved continuing professional development course means a course of training of up to six hours duration on continuing professional development topics as set out on the Board's website and delivered by an approved provider either in person or online.

Approved provider means a provider approved by the Board to deliver an approved continuing professional development course and notified on the Board's website.

(2) To be eligible to renew their annual practising licence, all journeymen plumbers applying to renew their licence for the licensing years beginning on 1 April 2018 and beyond must satisfy the Registrar that they have completed any approved continuing professional development course that has been notified as applying in the 12 month period prior to renewal.

Authorisation card

(3) All journeymen plumbers that hold a current annual practising licence are issued with an authorisation card by the Board.

(4) At all times when undertaking sanitary plumbing, a journeyman plumber must be able to produce their authorisation card on demand.

Part D - General

19. Licence period

The licence period is from 1 April to 31 March of the following year, provided that:

- (a) a licence is issued for a maximum period of one licensing year only;
- (b) all licences expire on 31 March irrespective of when in the licensing period they were issued subject to section 50 of the Act; and
- (c) a licence issued after 1 April is valid only from the date on which it is issued until its expiry on 31 March.

20. Application forms

The Board must provide the following forms:

- (a) Application for registration as a:
 - (i) certifying plumber;
 - (ii) tradesman plumber; and
 - (iii) journeyman plumber.
- (b) Application for licence as a:
 - (i) certifying plumber;
 - (ii) tradesman plumber; and
 - (iii) journeyman plumber.

21. Glossary

- (1) Where the term “sanitary plumbing” is used it refers to “sanitary plumbing” as defined in section 6 of the Act.
- (2) Where the term “supervision” is used it refers to “supervision” as defined in section 4 of the Act.
- (3) Where the term “verify” is used it refers to formal verification for the purposes of any Act or regulations that apply to the work.

Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (Gasfitting Registration and Licensing) Notice 2016

Pursuant to sections 28 and 30 of the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Act 2006 (“Act”), the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (“Board”) designates the following classes of registration for gasfitting and prescribes the following matters relating to gasfitting registration and licensing.

Notice

1. Title—This notice is the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (Gasfitting Registration and Licensing) Notice 2016.

2. Commencement—This notice comes into force on **6 December 2016**.

3. Revocation—This notice revokes the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (Gasfitting Registration and Licensing) Notice 2010 (published in the [New Zealand Gazette, 21 October 2010, No. 143, page 3608](#)).

Part A - Certifying gasfitter

4. Certifying gasfitting

The Board designates the certifying gasfitter class of gasfitting registration.

5. Authorised work

A certifying gasfitter who holds a current annual practising licence issued by the Board:

- (a) may carry out gasfitting;
- (b) may supervise gasfitting undertaken by the following people:
 - (i) tradesmen gasfitters;
 - (ii) journeymen gasfitters;
 - (iii) holders of provisional licences to do or assist in doing gasfitting pursuant to section 38 of the Act;
 - (iv) trainee gasfitters who hold limited certificates to do or assist in doing gasfitting pursuant to section 14 of the Act (“Trainee Gasfitters”); and
 - (v) persons doing or assisting in doing gasfitting pursuant to section 19 of the Act (“Exempt Persons”);
- (c) may test gasfitting; and
- (d) must verify gasfitting where verification is required.

6. Minimum standards for registration

Registration requirements

(1) To be registered as a certifying gasfitter a person must have:

(a) held a licence as a licensed or tradesman gasfitter (or registered gasfitter under the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Act 1976) for an aggregate period of not less than 24 months under the supervision of a certifying gasfitter (or a craftsman gasfitter under the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Act 1976), and passed the examination specified in paragraph 6(2) below; or

(b) where applying on the basis of an overseas gasfitting qualification:

(i) submitted a completed pre-registration application form to the Board that includes the following documentation:

A. an international qualifications assessment report from the New Zealand Qualifications Authority concluding that the applicant's gasfitting qualification is equivalent to, or greater than level 4 on the National Qualifications Framework;

B. unless the applicant has already been granted New Zealand residence, police certificates that are no older than six months from the applicant's country of citizenship (unless they can provide satisfactory evidence they have never lived there), and from any country the applicant has lived in for 12 months or more (whether in one visit or intermittently) in the last 10 years, that the Board assesses as meeting its fit and proper person requirements; and

C. evidence that the applicant has worked full-time in the gasfitting trade for six years or more; and

(ii) passed the Board's gasfitting advanced proficiency assessment (this practical assessment must be undertaken in New Zealand).

Certifying gasfitter competencies

(2) The examination a person must pass in order to register as a certifying gasfitter is Examination 9196 set by the Board.

(3) Examination 9196 will be set by the Board so that, in order to pass the examination, the applicant must demonstrate the ability to design, manage the installation of, and verify/certify gasfitting systems through possessing competencies in the areas of:

(a) Trade calculations and trade science used in the design and installation of gasfitting systems. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

(i) estimation, measurement, and calculation using management systems;

(ii) application of formulae;

(iii) physics laws and their application as they relate to gasfitting;

(iv) hydraulic principles;

(v) combustion and ventilation;

(vi) flame characteristics;

(vii) flammability limits;

(viii) gas rating;

(ix) heat input/output and efficiency calculations;

(x) expansion and contraction;

(xi) corrosion;

(xii) fluing;

(xiii) pipe size;

(xiv) fluid flow;

(xv) pressure; and

(xvi) volume.

(b) The drawings and specifications for gasfitting. Descriptors include, but are not limited to, the preparation of plans and specifications.

(c) The selection of materials, their properties, applications, and how they are used in the design and specification of gasfitting systems. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

(i) compatibility, testing, and commissioning procedures; and

(ii) alternative materials, approval regimes, and protection of material.

(d) The design, specification and verification/certification of gasfitting installations and system components. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) gas supply pipework, service lines, meters, and regulator systems;
- (ii) sizing the appliance to meet the duty required;
- (iii) domestic gas-fired appliances and equipment installations;
- (iv) commercial gas-fired appliances and equipment installations;
- (v) industrial gas-fired appliances and equipment installations;
- (vi) pressure and flow controls; and
- (vii) safety devices.

(e) The ability to access and apply relevant documentation relating to gasfitting to meet compliance requirements, and an understanding of the regulatory environment. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) Acts and regulations;
- (ii) standards;
- (iii) codes; and
- (iv) manufacturers' instructions.

(f) Management of the effect on the integrity of structures relating to the design and installation of gasfitting systems, including weather tightness considerations as they relate to penetrations to the building envelope and coordination with other services. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) preservation of structural integrity;
- (ii) prevention of damage to property including weather tightness; and
- (iii) positioning and protection of services along with the coordination with other building services.

(g) Responsibilities relating to managing health and safety. Descriptors include, but are not limited to, health and safety systems, and the preparation of safety plans.

(h) Responsibilities relating to the supervision of persons who do, or assist in doing, gasfitting.

Transitional provisions

(4) Any person who, at 4 July 2013, had passed Examination 9196 but has not passed the certifying common Examination 9194 that a person was required to pass from 1 April 2010 to 3 July 2013 is required to successfully complete one or more competence programmes focused on assessing the competencies previously covered in Examination 9194, as directed by the Registrar, before that person will be considered to meet the minimum standards for registration as a certifying gasfitter.

(5) Any person who, at 4 July 2013, has passed Examination 9194, that a person was required to pass from 1 April 2010 to 3 July 2013, but not Examination 9196, is required to pass Examination 9196 before that person will be considered to meet the minimum standards for registration as a certifying gasfitter.

(1) A certifying gasfitter must pay any monies owing to the Board as they become due, subject to any exceptions agreed to by the Board.

(2) A certifying gasfitter must provide the Board with all information required for the public register.

(c) comply with all relevant regulations, including regulations made under the Gas Act 1992;

(d) can produce their current authorisation card issued by the Board on demand; and

(e) do not undertake gasfitting while connected to a gas supply if the persons are Exempt Persons.

(10) A certifying gasfitter may nominate another currently licensed certifying gasfitter or tradesman gasfitter ("Nominated Person") to provide physical supervision of any person working under their supervision.

(4) Any person who was approved under the Board's Immigrant Qualification Assessment System prior to 4 July 2013 must pass Examination 9193 before that person will be considered to meet the minimum standards for registration as a tradesman gasfitter.

12. Terms and conditions of registration

(1) A tradesman gasfitter must pay any monies owing to the Board as they become due, subject to any exceptions agreed to by the Board.

(2) A tradesman gasfitter must provide the Board with all information required for the public register.

13. Terms and conditions of licence

Continuing professional development

(1) For the purposes of paragraph (2) below:

Approved continuing professional development course means a course of training of up to six hours duration on continuing professional development topics as set out on the Board's website and delivered by an approved provider either in person or online.

Approved provider means a provider approved by the Board to deliver an approved continuing professional development course and notified on the Board's website.

(2) To be eligible to renew their annual practising licence, all tradesmen gasfitters applying to renew their licence for the licensing years beginning on 1 April 2017 and beyond must satisfy the Registrar that they have completed any approved continuing professional development course that has been notified as applying in the 12 month period prior to renewal.

Authorisation card

(3) All tradesmen gasfitters that hold a current annual practising licence are issued with an authorisation card by the Board.

(4) At all times when undertaking gasfitting, a tradesmen gasfitter must be able to produce their authorisation card on demand.

Supervision

(5) A tradesman gasfitter must work at all times under the supervision of a certifying gasfitter.

(6) A tradesman gasfitter must notify the Board of the name and registration number of their supervising certifying gasfitter.

(7) A tradesman gasfitter who is nominated to provide physical supervision of a person must promptly notify the person's supervising certifying gasfitter of any concerns they have about the competency of the work done by that person or the safety measures in place in respect of the work done by that person.

Part C - Journeyman gasfitter

14. Journeyman gasfitter

The Board designates the journeyman gasfitter class of gasfitting registration.

15. Authorised work

A journeyman gasfitter who holds a current annual practising licence issued by the Board:

- (a) may carry out gasfitting under the supervision of a certifying gasfitter; and
- (b) may test gasfitting.

16. Minimum standards for registration

To be registered as a journeyman gasfitter a person must have successfully completed one of the following:

- (a) the National Certificate in gasfitting;
- (b) the third stage block course in gasfitting; or
- (c) the practice trade certificate in gasfitting.

17. Terms and conditions of registration

(1) A journeyman gasfitter must pay any monies owing to the Board as they become due, subject to any exceptions agreed to by the Board.

(2) A journeyman gasfitter must provide the Board with all information required for the public register.

18. Terms and conditions of licence

Continuing professional development

(1) For the purposes of paragraph (2) below:

Approved continuing professional development course means a course of training of up to six hours duration on continuing professional development topics as set out on the Board's website and delivered by an approved provider either in person or online.

Approved provider means a provider approved by the Board to deliver an approved continuing professional development course and notified on the Board's website.

(2) To be eligible to renew their annual practising licence, all journeymen gasfitters applying to renew their licence for the licensing years beginning on 1 April 2018 and beyond must satisfy the Registrar that they have completed any approved continuing professional development course that has been notified as applying in the 12 month period prior to renewal.

Authorisation card

(3) All journeymen gasfitters that hold a current annual practising licence are issued with an authorisation card by the Board.

(4) At all times when undertaking gasfitting, a journeyman gasfitter must be able to produce their authorisation card on demand.

Part D - General

19. Licence period

The licence period is from 1 April to 31 March of the following year, provided that:

- (a) a licence is issued for a maximum period of one licensing year only;
- (b) all licences expire on 31 March irrespective of when in the licensing period they were issued subject to section 50 of the Act; and
- (c) a licence issued after 1 April is valid only from the date on which it is issued until its expiry on 31 March.

20. Application forms

The Board must provide the following forms:

- (a) Application for registration as a:
 - (i) certifying gasfitter;
 - (ii) tradesman gasfitter; and
 - (iii) journeyman gasfitter.
- (b) Application for licence as a:
 - (i) certifying gasfitter;
 - (ii) tradesman gasfitter; and
 - (iii) journeyman gasfitter.

Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (Drainlaying Registration and Licensing) Notice 2016

Pursuant to sections 28 and 30 of the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Act 2006 (“Act”), the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (“Board”) designates the following classes of registration for drainlaying and prescribes the following matters relating to drainlaying registration and licensing.

Notice

1. Title—This notice is the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (Drainlaying Registration and Licensing) Notice 2016.

2. Commencement—This notice comes into force on **6 December 2016**.

3. Revocation—This notice revokes the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (Drainlaying Registration and Licensing) Notice 2010 (published in the [New Zealand Gazette, 21 October 2010, No. 143, page 3605](#)).

Part A - Certifying drainlayer

4. Certifying drainlayer

The Board designates the certifying drainlayer class of drainlaying registration.

5. Authorised work

A certifying drainlayer who holds a current annual practising licence issued by the Board:

- (a) may carry out drainlaying;

- (b) may supervise drainlaying undertaken by the following people:
 - (i) tradesmen drainlayers;
 - (ii) journeymen drainlayers;
 - (iii) holders of provisional licences to do or assist in doing drainlaying pursuant to section 38 of the Act;
 - (iv) trainee drainlayers who hold limited certificates to do or assist in doing drainlaying pursuant to section 14 of the Act (“Trainee Drainlayers”); and
 - (v) persons doing or assisting in doing drainlaying pursuant to section 19 of the Act (“Exempt Persons”);
- (c) may test drainlaying; and
- (d) must verify drainlaying where verification is required.

6. Minimum standards for registration

Registration requirements

- (1) A person who has held a registered drainlaying licence for the year ending 31 March 2010 will, upon application to the Board, be eligible to be licensed as a certifying drainlayer for the year ending 31 March 2011.
- (2) Applicants must satisfy the Board that they have advanced experience and proficiency in drainlaying.
- (3) These criteria are deemed to be met if the person:
 - (a) has held a drainlaying practising licence in the year ending 31 March 2009 and in the year ending 31 March 2010;
 - (b) is a registered drainlayer and has held a craftsman plumber licence in the year ending 31 March 2010; or
 - (c) supervised a limited certificate holder in drainlaying in the year ending 31 March 2010.
- (4) Persons not meeting the above criteria but who had signed their training agreement before 1 April 2010 will be required to submit an application to the Board to enable applicants to be assessed using the Board’s registered drainlayer transition process. Applicants may be required to submit one or both of the following:
 - (a) A letter or letters from one or more territorial authority inspectors who have observed the applicant on at least five drainlaying contracts as a limited certificate holder or registered drainlayer and can verify that the applicant undertook that drainlaying;
 - (b) details of at least five drainlaying contracts which the applicant has undertaken including dates, addresses, building consent numbers and photographs of the drainlaying contracts. The Board may require such information to be verified by a current or past employer or supervisor of the applicant.
- (5) Persons who have held a certifying drainlayer licence for the year ending 31 March 2011 will be eligible to be licensed as a certifying drainlayer in each year thereafter.
- (6) Any other person who has not held a registered drainlaying licence under the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Act 1976 for the year ending 31 March 2010 must, after 1 April 2010, have:
 - (a) held a licence as a licensed or tradesman drainlayer for an aggregate period of not less than 24 months under the supervision of a certifying drainlayer, and passed the examination specified in paragraph 6(7) below; or
 - (b) where applying on the basis of an overseas drainlaying qualification:
 - (i) submitted a completed pre-registration application form to the Board that includes the following documentation:
 - A. an international qualifications assessment report from the New Zealand Qualifications Authority concluding that the applicant’s drainlaying qualification is equivalent to, or greater than level 4 on the National Qualifications Framework;
 - B. unless the applicant has already been granted New Zealand residence, police certificates that are no older than six months from the applicant’s country of citizenship (unless they can provide satisfactory evidence they have never lived there), and from any country the applicant has lived in for 12 months or more (whether in one visit or intermittently) in the last 10 years, that the Board assesses as meeting its fit and proper person registration requirements; and
 - C. evidence that the applicant has worked full-time in the drainlaying trade for four years or more; and
 - (ii) passed the Board’s drainlaying advanced proficiency assessment (this practical assessment must be undertaken in New Zealand).

Certifying drainlayer competencies

- (7) The examination a person must pass in order to register as a certifying drainlayer is Examination 9198 set by the Board.

(8) Examination 9198 will be set by the Board so that, in order to pass the examination, the applicant must demonstrate the ability to design, manage the installation of, and verify drainlaying systems through possessing competencies in the areas of:

(a) Trade calculations and trade science used in the design and installation of drainlaying systems.

Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) estimation, measurement, and calculation using management systems;
- (ii) application of formulae;
- (iii) laws of physics and their application as they relate to drainlaying;
- (iv) hydraulic principles;
- (v) expansion and contraction;
- (vi) corrosion protection;
- (vii) water quality (black, grey, recycled); and
- (viii) density;

(b) The specification of materials; their properties, applications, and how they are used in the design and specification of drainage systems.

(c) The ability to access and apply relevant documentation relating to drainlaying to meet compliance requirements, and an understanding of the regulatory environment. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) Acts and regulations;
- (ii) standards;
- (iii) codes; and
- (iv) manufacturers' instructions.

(d) The design and verification of foul water and stormwater drainage systems for drainlaying. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) foul water systems;
- (ii) stormwater systems;
- (iii) trade waste systems;
- (iv) on-site effluent disposal systems; and
- (v) on-site wastewater treatment systems.

(e) Management of the effect on structures and sites relating to the design and installation of drainage systems, and coordination with other services.

(f) Responsibilities relating to managing health and safety. Descriptors include, but are not limited to, health and safety systems, and the preparation of safety plans.

(g) Responsibilities relating to the oversight and/or supervision of persons who do, or assist in doing, drainlaying.

Transitional provisions

(9) Any person who, at 4 July 2013, had passed Examination 9198 but has not passed the certifying common Examination 9194 that a person was required to pass from 1 April 2010 to 3 July 2013, is required to successfully complete one or more competence programmes focused on assessing the competencies previously covered in Examination 9194, as directed by the Registrar, before that person will be considered to meet the minimum standards for registration as a certifying drainlayer.

(10) Any person who, at 4 July 2013, has passed Examination 9194 that a person was required to pass from 1 April 2010 to 3 July 2013, but not Examination 9198, is required to pass Examination 9198 before that person will be considered to meet the minimum standards for registration as a certifying drainlayer.

7. Terms and conditions of registration

(1) A certifying drainlayer must pay any monies owing to the Board as they become due, subject to any exceptions agreed to by the Board.

(2) A certifying drainlayer must provide the Board with all information required for the public register.

8. Terms and conditions of licence

Continuing professional development

(1) For the purposes of paragraph (2) below:

(8) A certifying drainlayer must ensure that drainlaying undertaken by persons under their supervision:

- (a) is performed competently;
- (b) is subject to appropriate safety measures; and
- (c) complies with the requirements of all relevant regulations, including regulations made under the Building Act 2004.

(9) A certifying drainlayer must ensure that all persons under their supervision:

- (a) are competent to perform the tasks undertaken;
- (b) are adequately supervised while carrying out drainlaying;
- (c) comply with all relevant regulations, including regulations made under the Building Act 2004; and
- (d) can produce their current authorisation card issued by the Board on demand.

(10) A certifying drainlayer may nominate another currently licensed certifying drainlayer or tradesman drainlayer ("Nominated Person") to provide physical supervision of any person working under their supervision.

(11) A certifying drainlayer remains responsible at all times for all aspects of the work done by a person under their supervision even where they have nominated another certifying drainlayer or tradesman drainlayer to provide physical supervision of that work.

(12) A certifying drainlayer who is nominated to provide physical supervision of a person must promptly notify the person's supervising certifying drainlayer of any concerns they have about the work done by that person or the safety measures in place in respect of the work done by that person.

(13) A certifying drainlayer must ensure that, during the first 12 months of holding a limited certificate to do or assist in doing drainlaying, a Trainee Drainlayer under their supervision works at all times in their presence or in the presence of a Nominated Person.

(14) A certifying drainlayer must ensure that, during the first 24 months of doing or assisting in doing drainlaying under an exemption under section 25 of the Act, an Exempt Person under their supervision works at all times in their presence or in the presence of a Nominated Person.

Part B - Tradesman drainlayer

9. Tradesman drainlayer

(1) The Board designates the tradesman drainlayer class of drainlaying registration.

(2) All drainlayers registered as licensed drainlayers under the Plumbers, Gasfitters, and Drainlayers Board (Drainlaying Registration and Licensing) Notice 2010 are now deemed to be registered as tradesmen drainlayers.

10. Authorised work

A tradesman drainlayer who holds a current annual practising licence issued by the Board:

- (a) may carry out drainlaying under the supervision of a certifying drainlayer;

- (b) may physically supervise, as a Nominated Person, drainlaying undertaken by a person under supervision; and
- (c) may test drainlaying.

11. Minimum standards for registration

Registration requirements

(1) To become a tradesman drainlayer, a person must have:

- (a) obtained the National Certificate in drainlaying and passed the examination specified in paragraph 11(2) below; or
- (b) where the person is applying on the basis of an overseas drainlaying qualification:
 - (i) submitted a completed pre-registration application form to the Board that includes the following documentation:
 - A. an international qualifications assessment report from the New Zealand Qualifications Authority concluding that the applicant's drainlaying qualification is equivalent to, or greater than level 4 on the National Qualifications Framework;
 - B. unless the applicant has already been granted New Zealand residence, police certificates that are no older than six months from the applicant's country of citizenship (unless they can provide satisfactory evidence they have never lived there), and from any country the applicant has lived in for 12 months or more (whether in one visit or intermittently) in the last 10 years, that the Board assesses as meeting its fit and proper person registration requirements; and
 - C. evidence that the applicant has worked full-time in the drainlaying trade for four years or more; and
 - (ii) passed the examination specified in paragraph 11(2) below, which they may sit in their home country by arrangement with the Board.

Tradesman drainlayer competencies

(2) The examination a person must pass in order to register as a tradesman drainlayer is Examination 9197 set by the Board.

(3) Examination 9197 is set by the Board so that, in order to pass the examination, the applicant must demonstrate knowledge, and the experience and practical ability to install, test, commission, fault-find, and maintain drainage systems through possessing competencies in the areas of:

- (a) Trade calculations and trade sciences. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:
 - (i) estimation, measurement, and calculation using measurement systems;
 - (ii) application of formulae;
 - (iii) laws of physics and their application as they relate to drainlaying;
 - (iv) hydraulic principles;
 - (v) expansion and contraction;
 - (vi) corrosion protection; and
 - (vii) water quality (black, grey, recycled and potable).

(b) The installation, testing, commissioning, fault-finding, and maintenance of foul water and stormwater systems for drainlaying. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) foul water systems;
- (ii) stormwater systems;
- (iii) trade waste systems;
- (iv) on-site effluent disposal systems; and
- (v) on-site wastewater treatment systems.

(c) Limitations in and the application of materials used in drainlaying, including material protection and jointing methods. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:

- (i) copper;
- (ii) polyvinylchloride (PVC);
- (iii) asbestos;
- (iv) polyethylene (PE);
- (v) stainless steel;

- (vi) acrylonitrile butadiene styrene (ABS);
 - (vii) polypropylene;
 - (viii) brass/bronze;
 - (ix) cast iron;
 - (x) steel;
 - (xi) earthenware;
 - (xii) concrete;
 - (xiii) bedding materials and backfill; and
 - (xiv) the use of tools and equipment.
- (d) Drawings and specifications for drainlaying. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:
- (i) interpreting plans and specifications; and
 - (ii) drawing as-built plans.
- (e) The ability to access and apply relevant documentation relating to drainlaying to meet compliance requirements, and an understanding of the regulatory environment. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:
- (i) Acts and regulations;
 - (ii) standards;
 - (iii) codes; and
 - (iv) manufacturers' instructions.
- (f) Responsibilities relating to health and safety. Descriptors include, but are not limited to:
- (i) personal and public safety;
 - (ii) site safety including safety precautions for earthworks and excavations;
 - (iii) electrical safety;
 - (iv) environmental considerations; and
 - (v) other services' location.
- (g) Limitations on persons who can do, or assist in doing, drainlaying.
