Termination of Countervailing Duties on Canned Peaches From the European Union

Pursuant to section 14(7) of the Dumping and Countervailing Duties Act 1988 ("the Act"), I hereby terminate the countervailing duties imposed on the subject goods described in the Schedule to this notice, with effect from 3 July 2009, because a review under section 14(8) of the Act has determined that the goods are not currently subsidised and that there is not likely to be a recurrence of subsidisation in the foreseeable future.
