- 1. Title—This notice is the Health and Safety at Work (Maritime New Zealand) Agency Designation 2015.
- 2. Commencement—This notice comes into force on 4 April 2016.
- **3. Interpretation**—In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires:

Act means the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015;

MNZ means Maritime New Zealand;

ships does not include naval ships or ships of, or pertaining to, the Armed Forces.

- **4. Designation**—(1) MNZ is designated as a designated agency under section 191 of the Act.
- (2) MNZ may perform all the functions and exercise all the powers of the regulator under the Act in respect of:
 - a. work on board ships; and
 - b. ships as workplaces.
