Ministerial Exemptions Under the Anti-Money Laundering and Countering Financing of Terrorism Act 2009

In accordance with section 157(6)(b) of the Anti-Money Laundering and Countering Financing of Terrorism Act 2009 ("Act"), the Associate Minister of Justice hereby gives notice that he has granted the following exemption from the Act:

Ministerial exemption: New Zealand Catholic Education Office Finance Limited (NZBN: 9429037228309)

- As the Associate Minister of Justice, and pursuant to section 157 of the Anti-Money Laundering and Countering Financing of Terrorism Act 2009, I exempt New Zealand Catholic Education Office Finance Limited (NZCEOF) from the following provisions of the Act:
 - a. Sections 10–71 inclusive.
- 2. This exemption is made subject to the following condition:
 - a. NZCEOF must inform the Ministry of Justice of any changes that may affect the exemption within 14 days of when the change occurs.
- 3. This exemption has been made for the following reasons:
 - a. the risk of money laundering and terrorist financing associated with NZCEOF's business activities is low because:
 - i. NZCEOF does not accept deposits from members of the public and there is no opportunity for individuals to deposit funds into the loan pool as an investment;
 - ii. The source of funds is easily and readily traceable; and
 - iii. NZCEOF's trust deed, through its charitable purpose, specifically details what loans may be used for and NZCEOF is bound to follow that purpose.
 - b. NZCEOF, in the absence of an exemption, would be subject to an undue regulatory burden; and
 - c. renewing this exemption is unlikely to affect third-party reporting entities.
- 4. This exemption comes into force on 2 July 2018.
- 5. This exemption will expire on **30 June 2023**.
