## Start of Step 1 of An Investigation Into the Alleged Dumping of Preserved Peaches From China

In accordance with section 10B(2) of the Trade (Anti-dumping and Countervailing Duties) Act 1988 ("Act"), and acting under delegated authority from the Chief Executive of the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment, I give notice that I have started step 1 (investigation step 1) of an investigation into the alleged dumping of the goods described in the Schedule to this notice ("subject goods").

Investigation step 1 was started, in accordance with the requirements of section 10A of the Act, following consideration of a properly documented application (as required by section 10(2) and (3) of the Act) made by Heinz Wattie's Limited (HWL), the New Zealand industry producing preserved peaches, which provided sufficient evidence justifying the need for an investigation and had the requisite industry support.

Investigation step 1 started on 29 November 2022.
