

Approval of a Lead Clinician to Provide Opioid Substitution Treatment Under Section 24A of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1975

Acting under delegated authority from the Minister of Health, I, Dr John Crawshaw:

1. Revoke the approval of Te Whatu Ora – Te Pae Hauora o Ruahine o Tararua MidCentral Opioid Substitution Treatment Service and medical practitioner issued pursuant to sections 24A(7)(a) and (b) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1975 on 3 July 2024 (as published in the [New Zealand Gazette, 5 July 2024, Notice No. 2024-go3208](#)); and
2. Specify Te Whatu Ora – Te Pae Hauora o Ruahine o Tararua MidCentral Opioid Substitution Treatment Service as a service that may provide treatment with controlled drugs for people who are dependent on controlled drugs, pursuant to section 24A(7)(b) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1975, at the following places:

Ruahine House

Palmerston North Hospital

Palmerston North 4410; and

Horowhenua Health Centre

Levin 5510; and

3. Pursuant to section 24A(7)(a) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1975, specify that Dr James Marshall, as a medical practitioner, may:
 - a. prescribe, administer or supply controlled drugs for the treatment of dependence as the lead clinician for Te Whatu Ora – Te Pae Hauora o Ruahine o Tararua MidCentral Opioid Substitution Treatment Service;
 - b. authorise in writing service/clinic medical practitioners as specified under subsection 24A(2)(b) to:
 - i. prescribe, administer or supply controlled drugs for the treatment of dependence;
 - ii. authorise in writing general practitioners receiving clients from Te Whatu Ora – Te Pae Hauora o Ruahine o Tararua MidCentral Opioid Substitution Treatment Service as specified under section 24A(2)(b) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1975; and
 - c. authorise in writing general practitioners receiving clients from Te Whatu Ora – Te Pae Hauora o Ruahine o Tararua MidCentral Opioid Substitution Treatment Service as specified under section 24A(2)(b) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1975.

Conditions

1. Controlled drugs may only be prescribed, administered or supplied to people who are or have been clients of Te Whatu Ora – Te Pae Hauora o Ruahine o Tararua MidCentral Opioid Substitution Treatment Service.
2. This approval commences on 30 September 2024 and expires on 30 September 2026.
